We moved back to Huntington, WV were I attended Huntington High School. I signed with NC State, I was selected in the 15th round by the Washington Nationals. I decided to sign with the Nationals. The day after I signed both my best friends died in a car crash on their way back from a senior trip, which I flew home early from to sign. I was suppose to be in the car. I now own Aces Baseball Academy in Huntington, WV. I run it till I have to report to season.
